CONVICTION

Conviction or core beliefs are opinions, attitudes, beliefs that a person holds as true and is certain of and no longer questions their authenticity.

Conviction: is confidence in your beliefs and determination to live them out

But someone will say, "You have faith, and I have works." Show me your faith without your works, and I will show you my faith by my works. . . . For as the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without works is dead also. (James 2:18, 26)

It is not those who say Lord, Lord, who will enter the kingdom but those who do the will of my father. (Matt 7:21)

What is the basic conviction that underlies, penetrates and motivates your every thought, word and action? To give an honest answer may be enlightening!

Pope Paul VI said it another way: "Who are you and where do you come from?" A simple yet profound question. Think about the answer you might give...

Is being a Christian fundamental to who you are, how you think and act, what you do or do not say? A Christian is one who has been convinced, by the grace of God, that Jesus Christ

is the Way the Truth and the Life. This conviction colours every aspect of an authentic Christian's life.

Cursillistas are convinced of God's personal and unconditional love. Their overwhelming *conviction* is the unconditional love of Jesus Christ for all God's children, especially the 'faraway'.

The enthusiasm of early cursillistas was born of this deep and certain conviction which set people ablaze in the early days of the cursillo movement.
